GOD'S DIRECTION

From the beginning Living Stones Academy (LSA) has been guided by the Triune God. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, He prompted a small group of people to imagine a Christ-centered education that would be academically rigorous and radically inclusive. They were longing for a place where families of all races, cultures, educational backgrounds, and income levels would be welcomed, and could work together to build community.

From the beginning Living Stones Academy has also been rooted in prayer. At every turn the LSA community has sought God's guidance and provision, fully aware that this is His school. On a number of occasions people have gathered on their knees in living rooms and classrooms to fervently pray for God's leading.

This was true in 2010 when a small group of people boldly hired a head of school and signed a three-year lease before any students had enrolled. It was still true in the spring of 2014 when school leadership signed a purchase agreement to buy Hillcrest Elementary at 1415 Lyon St. NE

to secure a long-term home. Living Stones Academy's commitment to offering a rigorous, Christ-centered eduction to all who seek it remains at the heart of who we are.

This spring the Living Stones Academy board reaffirmed this calling by approving a sharpened mission statement: "We're a neighborhood Christian school committed to inspiring the hearts and minds of our students, equipping them to embrace cultural, economic, and racial diversity; and empowering them to love and serve in community."



6 At LSA, we teach kids that diversity isn't an image or a marketing tool, it's an identity. Justice is less about 'saving' someone than identifying and dismantling systems that favor one group of people over another. Reconciliation isn't something that happens in our heads but something that happens in authentic relationship with God and with each other.



Living Stones Academy emerged to fill a real need in our city. For many, a Christian education was perceived as exclusive and unattainable—dividing along racial, cultural, and economic lines. In response, Living Stones Academy committed to being an intentionally inclusive school where all people would be welcomed. Here, we throw open our doors and pursue families for whom Christian education has been

previously unattainable. We developed a sliding-scale tuition model to remove one of the greatest barriers, cost. But our core philosophy goes far beyond scholarships and financial help. We focus on relationships and fully living out the Gospel so that everyone can flourish—as students, as members of our community, and as children of God.

WHY DOES **ALL THIS MATTER?**

Because the needs of the world are great. In our own community we see the damaging effects of cyclical poverty, rampant materialism, segregation, and lack of access to quality education.

As followers of Jesus we grieve this brokenness; we know God created the world for so much more. We also know He has called us to be people who "act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with Him." Consequently, we respond to these needs not with fear but with hope. God is at work—and He has invited us to join Him.

At Living Stones Academy, we are called to train, shape, and nurture the students and families God has entrusted to our care. That means creating an environment where students can build authentic relationships with one another and with teachers; it also means offering an education that will challenge and inspire them as they learn about God's world and their place in it.



STUDENTS ENROLLED BY YEAR



One Word: Lunch.	Some of our students come to school hungry. To serve them well, we need a commercial kitchen to offer a school lunch program.
Improve Accessibility.	Our 61-year-old building wasn't built with our mission in mind. To welcome all, we need to improve accessibility in our hallways and bathrooms.
Extend our Stability.	Roof, windows, boiler, asphalt. Replacing these will extend the duration of our building (and our school).
Make our Building our Home.	A school is more than a building structure—it's a place where kids grow. Our kids will receive a richer educational experience by providing a playground, improved lighting, and creating a welcoming atmosphere.
Develop our Staff.	In order to deliver our educational goals, we must continue to invest in our teachers through professional development, visiting sister institutions and exposing them to best practices within the field.
Grow in Digital Literacy.	We don't want our students to have an average education—we want them to learn with the most current tools available. We also want to provide technology in our community room so that all our families can have access to the Internet.
